# Germs Memory

## Materials:

Germs Cards (printed out)

Scissors

## How to play:

1. Print out the cards and cut them out.
2. Place all cards in a 4x4 grid upside down at random.
3. Turn over two cards. If they match leave them turned face up. If they don't match turn them back over and try again. Continue until all cards are face up.

## Lessons:

- Germs are *microscopic* living creatures that can make us sick if they get inside our bodies.
- The best way to prevent against germs making us sick is by washing our hands.
- There are 4 types of germs:
  - Bacteria: One-celled creatures that use nutrients from their environment
  - Virus: Rely on a host (like a person) to survive
  - Fungi: Many-celled, plant-like creatures that like damp, warm places
  - Protozoa: One-celled creatures that spread disease through water
